Operations Managers' Report for Streets, Fleet and Parks for May & June of 2019

Streets-

- Weed Spraying and Weed eating of Street Cracks is ongoing
- Alley ways are being sprayed for weeds
- Quote for line painting and thermals is back in
- We ordered in 25 ton of road base to start filling holes and leveling off alley ways, starting on the alley between 3rd St and 2nd St, just south of Hill Street is our most egregious problem areas.
- We finished clearing out the County Shop for the demo of the building
- After cleanup day, we did some clean up at the Welding Shop to get things up to the dumpsters, as well as some very large tress stumps in our Green dump area. Cleaned up a few things around town hall and the plant to take to the dumpsters
- Pot holes are filled as they are seen pop up
- Cartegraph, we had our requirements meeting on the 24th of this month training starts on the IPads and the portal online

Fleet-

- The blue dump truck had some major repairs done to it

Parks-

- Flowers were planted at Town Hall
- Tree Board had a final work day, we pruned trees and shrubs along 1st St by Hwy 34 and the West Wedge and also the Triangle at the Latham Ditch with the Welcome to Kersey Sign
- Playground Handle @Kholer was repaired
- The pump house off Clarke St was cleared out and ready to see if it can be put back into use

-GOCO Grant for Centennial Park

- Horseshoe pits are about 80% complete, we just need to buy and install 2 more spikes and go pick up a load of sand for the individual pits.
- Dirt from Sturgeon Electric was graciously donated to the project and excess is being stored at Water Tower Park
- You may see the Shelter start to go up at the end of June, pending building permit approval

- Playground was completed however is still not open to the public, without the safety mulch the playground will remain closed. Signs have been posted as well as the orange fence. Once concrete goes in the mulch will be installed and the playground can be opened.
- Concrete is still slated for the 1st or 2nd week of July depending on Shelter build
- Sod, and irrigation and trees will now be more of a Fall project to ensure we do not lose any landscaping to heat stress or foot traffic during Kersey Days, the site is slated to be open for Kersey days and all pits, concrete, playground and dirt work will be completed by then

Kersey Recreation Board Report

June 2019

Summer programs are in full swing and fall planning and preparations have begun!

Our summer youth baseball and softball teams are off to a rocky start with unexpected weather cancellations, but everyone is holding in there and playing hard. We have two youth boy's baseball teams, a 9U and 11U team; as well as one youth girls' softball team at 12U. All three teams are a few games into the season and having a great time.

There teams once again participated in the Colorado Rockies fundraiser; tickets were sold for the Sunday June 30th game where the kids will walk the warning track before the game with many other youth teams from around the state. All our kids did a great job selling tickets; between three teams we sold over 200 tickets netting us around \$1800.00 raised to help purchase new equipment, cover some registration fees and provide new uniforms for each player.

We also saw a large spike in our t-ball and coach pitch registrations; the past two summers we have averaged around two complete teams for both t-ball and coach pitch, this season we have three teams of each all with almost full 12 person rosters! This year we spent quite a bit more in equipment purchases, however, seeing the increase in participation numbers like we are is huge!

Swimming lessons will continue throughout the summer; we have a total of five sessions that kids can sign up for. The first session in June has been and will most likely continue to be the most popular; however, we are seeing a slight increase in registrations throughout the other sessions as well.

All our fall program registrations are already underway; we opened them at the end of the school year to try and entice early enrollment. This fall will continue with our traditional programs: Hot Shots Soccer (K-2nd), Hot Shots Flag Football (K-4th), NVAA Volleyball (K-6th) and a newly added fall season for NVAA Soccer (3rd-6th). NVAA Soccer is usually held in the spring, but as our league has changed and added new members, we thought about trying a fall league as well. It will be interesting to see if we retain enough numbers for registrations as tackle football usually draws large registrations in the fall.

There are still a lot of things happening this summer; we have one more movie night in July, Splash Day, the circus and of course Kersey Days!

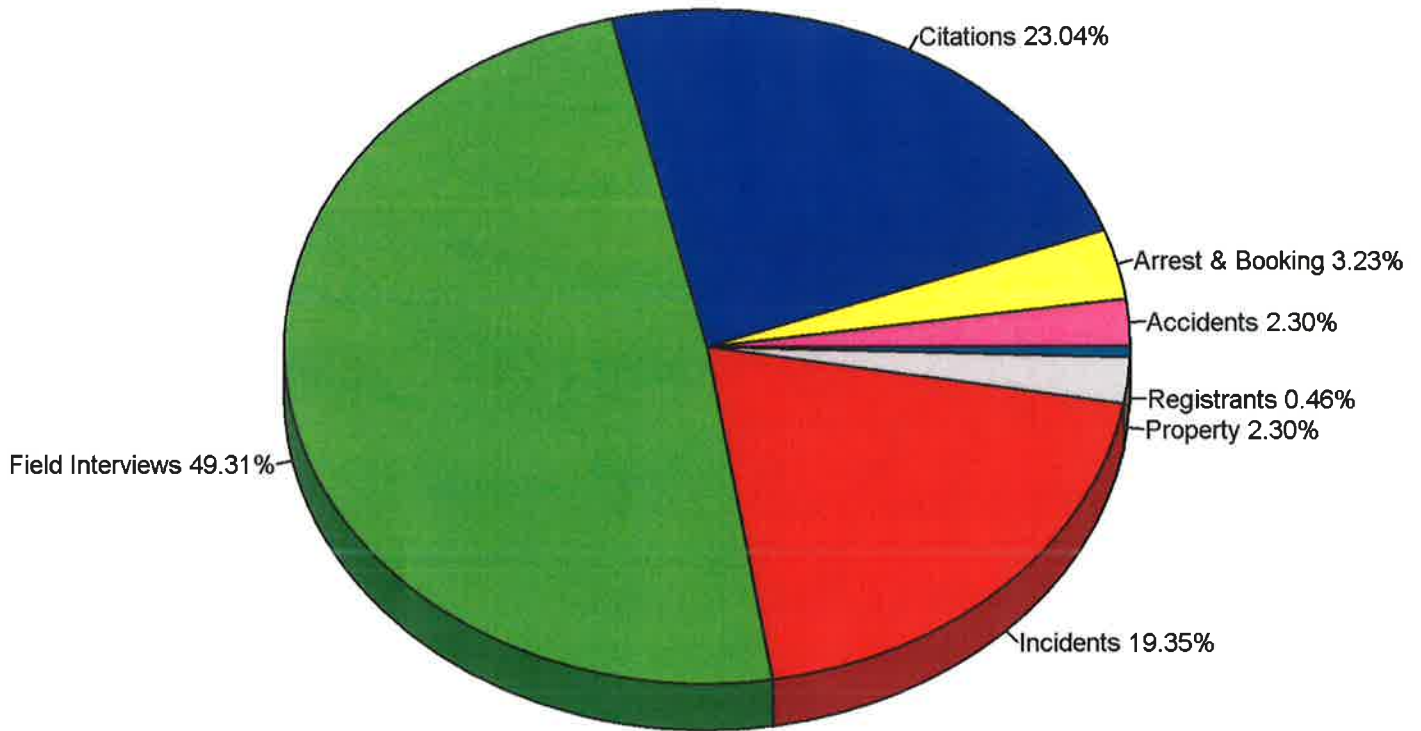
